Key vocabulary:

Key facts / Knowledge:

- A habitat is a place where living things live. Habitats include woodland, garden, ponds, deserts, and the Arctic.
- Plants and trees are living things.
- Parts of a plants and trees include the roots, stem, leaves, trunk, branch, flowers and petals.
- Plants need air, sunlight, warmth, water and nutrients from soil to grow.
- Flowers are brightly coloured to attract insects.
- Living things change over time.
- Female butterflies lay eggs on plants. Caterpillars hatch from the eggs. Caterpillars eat until they are fully grown, then they become a chrysalis. A butterfly emerges from a chrysalis.
- Butterflies, ladybirds and bees are insects.
- Insects are small animals that have six legs and a hard outer shell. Some insects have wings.
- The weather can change throughout the day, week and month. The weather is different at different times in the year.
- It is important to wear sun cream, sun hats and drink plenty of water to keep hydrated on hot days.
- Wearing sunscreen, a hat and sunglasses can protect the skin and eyes from sun damage.
